


Code Upload

In order to upload the app code into the submission site, it needs to be packaged. Instructions are here <http://appinventor.mit.edu/explore/ai2/share.html> and below. This is an important step to learn as it is also relevant for combining app code that has been done on more than one account.

As you submit your idea, you'll need to include your source code

- On the Source Code submission page, you'll be prompted to select from a dropdown which development platform your team used to code your project.
- Select your platform.

Then, depending on the platform you chose, you will have different options to submit your source code. Review the instructions below for how to submit source code for the coding language you used for your project.

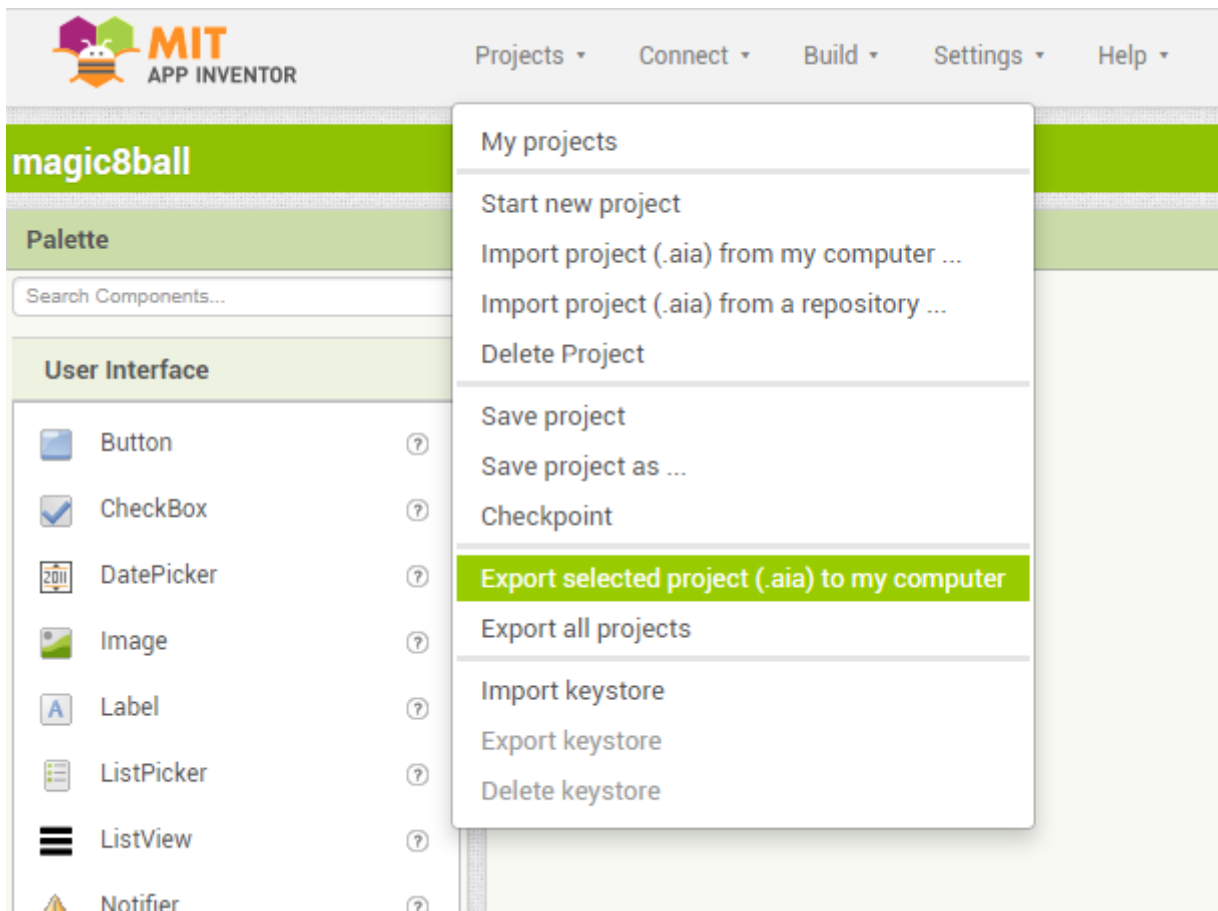

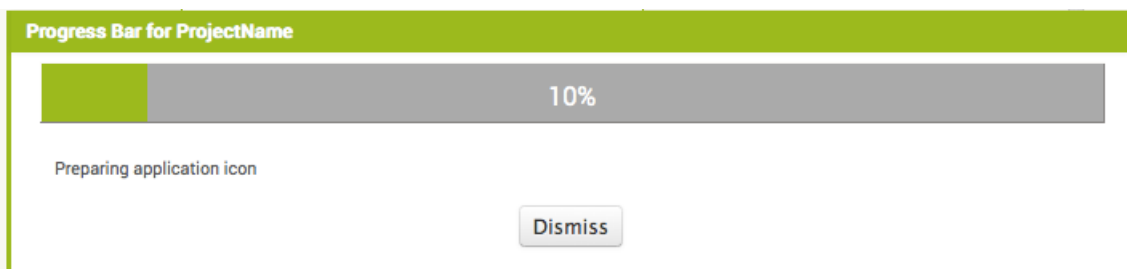
App Inventor Source Code Submission

- Download your source code from your App Inventor project page.
- **We only accept .aia files for App Inventor submissions.**
- In the top menu options of App Inventor, click "Projects" and then "Export selected project (.aia) to my computer"
- Upload your project file to the submission page.

Select "Application (Save to my Computer)." A pop-up box may alert you that your download has begun.



Sharing your app for remix

Choose **File | Export Project** to export the source code (blocks) for your project. The source code is downloaded in a .aia file. If you send it to a friend, they can open it with **File | Import Project**.

Combining Code

For those teams with more than one coder, doing screens on different accounts, use the AI2 Project Merger (PC only). Download the jar file and run it. [Download the AI2 Project Merger](#)

Advice - all of their screens differently beforehand so that when the projects are merged into one app there aren't any screens dropped - like, you can't have two Screen2s. It will save a lot of time.

One problem is that Screen1 in App Inventor is always Screen1. So they might have to lose one of their Screen1s in the merge and then recode it in the final version.

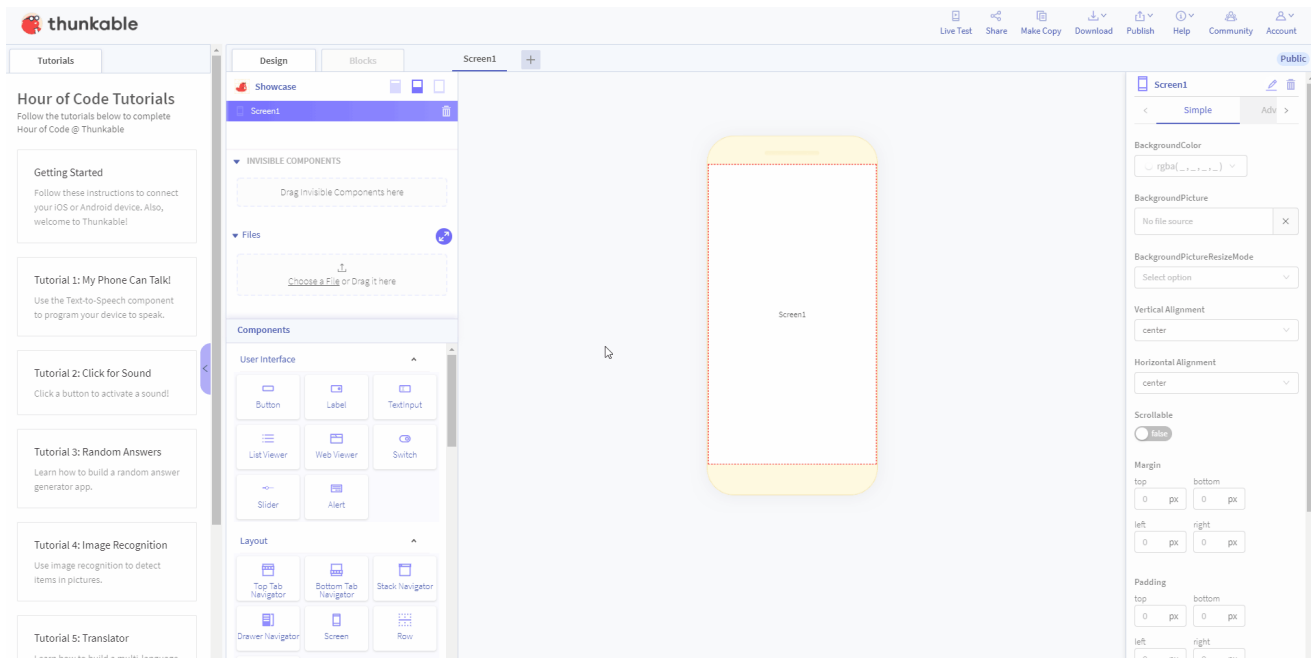

Thinkable Source Code Submission

- You do not have to download any of the code. Your team can generate a link to share.
- You can create a link by clicking "Share" on the right side on their project page.
- Copy the link that is generated and copy it to your submission for your Technovation Girls submission.
